



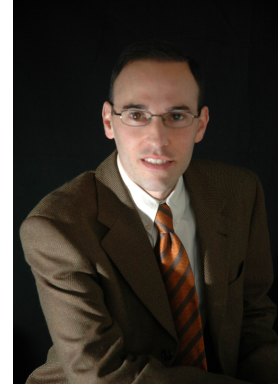
## Daryl Landau, M.A., M.Sc., Acc.FM

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**Daryl Landau** has been helping people to resolve problems for over ten years. He helps spouses separate through mediation, a process that can benefit parents and children. He also helps couples who want to stay together, to renew their trust, love, and respect.



Daryl has been an Accredited Family Mediator (Ontario Association for Family Mediation) from 1997 to the present<sup>1</sup>. Daryl is also an active member of the ADR Institute of Ontario.

In addition to his Master's degree in Conflict Analysis and Resolution from George Mason University (U.S.), he has about two hundred hours of additional mediation training, including about 70 in family mediation. He also took 14 hours of family law training in addition to his family mediation courses. He completed a one-year certificate program in Brief and Narrative Therapy at the Hincks-Dellcrest Institute (in association with U of T). He also completed one year as a volunteer counsellor at the West End Walk-In Clinic.

Daryl regularly teaches "Conflict Management and Mediation" and other public courses in cooperation with Conrad Grebel College and Cooperative Solutions. He has taught "Community Conflict Resolution" (U of Waterloo), and "Culture and Diversity" in McMaster's family mediation program.

Daryl is an experienced mediator who has trained thousands of new mediators. His expertise lies in healing damaged relationships and assisting in creative problem solving. He is co-author of *From Conflict To Creativity* (Jossey Bass, 2001).

In addition to family work, he consults extensively to workplaces on conflict resolution and human rights issues.

Daryl has long been a volunteer community mediator helping with neighbour and other disputes.
